Meet our three speakers

Dr. Manu-Shankar Hari MD, PhD, MSc, FRCA
NIHR Clinician Scientist, Reader and Consultant in Intensive Care Medicine



Manu Shankar-Hari, is an NIHR Clinician Scientist and Reader and Consultant in Intensive Care Medicine. A Trivandrum Medical College Alumni from the 1992 batch, he undertook his clinical training in prestigious institutions in and around London. Manu completed MSc in Epidemiology at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. Manu was awarded PhD in Immunology, for his research into in Blymphocyte and immunoglobulins biology in sepsis, at King's College London.

Manu was awarded the prestigious NIHR Clinician Scientist Award in 2016. He was recognised for his contributions to sepsis research with the ANZICS Intensive Care Global rising star award in 2017 and International Sepsis Forum Lowry Fink Fellowship in 2019.

Currently, Manu leads a translational research group, located within the School of Immunology and Microbial Sciences, KCL. He leads several projects funded by NIHR/MRC-EME programme and co-leads the convalescent plasma treatment in patients who are severely ill with COVID-19 as part of the REMAP-CAP trial. Manu will talk to us about tertiary care management and the immunobiology of Covid-19.

Dr. Ajaya Ghosh MD, DNB, DRCOG, MRCGP, PG Dip Cardiology Lead GP Partner at St. James Medical Centre

Dr. Ajay Ghosh is currently the lead GP partner at St Johns Medical Centre, Walsall which comprises a 5 partner practice of more than 10,000 patients. An active educator, Ajay is the GP trainer for NHS Midlands and a tutor for Keele University Medical Students. Ajay is a Trivandrum Medical College Alumni from the 1990 batch.

Ajay completed his postgraduate training as a Respiratory Physician in the prestigious JIPMER, Pondicherry, completing his MD. He was also awarded the National Board Diplomate Certificate (DNB) in Respiratory Medicine. With his background, he works as General Practitioner with special interest in Respiratory Medicine, Cardiology, Anticoagulation.

Ajay has been actively working in the forefront with COVID-19 patients in primary care as well as managing primary care hot hubs for COVID-19 in Midlands. He is an active ATMG-UK Executive committee member along with his better half Dr. Sabita Nair who is the current cultural secretary of the organisation. Ajay will talk about his experiences with managing COVID suspected patients in primary care hot hubs in Walsall, West Midlands.


Dr. Augustine Joseph Pereira MStud (Cantab), FFPH (UK), FFPHMI (Ireland)
